Parent End of Year Questionnaire

FEEDBACK 2013-14

Out of a potential 210 pupils, 68 parents took part in the questionnaire (it is unknown how many families are represented). All figures were rounded for ease of understanding.

Wellbeing & Safety

(1) My child is happy at this school:

94% of parents felt that their children were happy with just two parent disagreeing (where responses were negative, this parent's response was negative on most instances). Results were very similar to last year. Two parents disagreed this year whereas last year, just one parent did. 92% of pupils across the school said that they were happy at the school.

(2) My child feels safe at this school

97% of parents felt that their children were safe (last year 98%) with one parent saying that they didn't know. One parent responded negatively as they did on most questions. 93% of pupils overall said that they felt safe

(4) My child is well looked after at this school

99% of parents felt that their children were well looked after with two parents in disagreement.

Teaching & Learning

(3) My child makes good progress at this school

90% of parents felt that their children made good progress with 2 parents disagreeing.

(5) My child is taught well at this school

93% of parents felt that their children were well taught with 3 parents saying that they didn't know & 2 saying that they disagreed.

(6) My child receives appropriate homework for their age

85% of parent responded positively to the issue of appropriate homework (very similar to the children's views at 84%). This is an increase on last year's figures of 76% of parents responding positively & 78% of pupils. This comes on the back of a new homework policy introduced in September 2013 (as a result of the findings of the Parent & Pupil Questionnaires held last year). However, judging by the comments that were written by both by parents as well as the children, it would be difficult for this to be an entirely positive outcome, as some preferred to have no homework at all! **Homework will need to continue to be carefully considered by teachers & include differentiation according to ability. We will continue the opt in or out of home learning projects with set homework tasks based around Reading, Spellings & Maths activities.**

Behaviour

(7) This school makes sure that its pupils are well behaved

91% of parents felt that pupils are well behaved, 4% didn't know & 3 parents responded negatively to this comment. **In order to maintain consistency & excellent behaviour, teachers will ensure that the Establishment Phase is used to focus on the very highest standards of behaviour & that these are insisted upon on a daily basis using the positive reward system. Additionally, anyone covering PPA must use the same systems in order to ensure consistency.**

(8) This school deals effectively with bullying

72% of parents felt that bullying is dealt with effectively as opposed to 48% last year. This is a good increase as a result of our considerable work on Anti-Bullying & the No Touch Rule. 21% of parents said that they didn't know (suggesting that they may have not encountered bullying as an issue and/or do not know how it is dealt with) which is an improvement on the 46% who didn't know last year.

7% disagreed that the school dealt effectively with bullying & referred to very specific instances that they felt were bullying. However, on investigation, these were found to be 'falling outs' between children on both sides, rather than actual instances of bullying.

As for last year, 92% of pupils felt that other children were friendly in school. Percentages were highest in Y1, Y5 & Y6 (100%).

Figures would suggest a continued response to our back to basics approach to Bullying & that this needs to be well communicated to children & parents alike.

Leadership & Management

(9) This school is well led & managed

91% of parents felt that this was the case, 9% didn't know & no one responded negatively.

(10) This school responds well to any concerns I raise

As for last year, 87% of parents felt that concerns were well responded to & 6% didn't know (suggesting that they hadn't had concerns that needed to be responded to). 5 parents felt that their concerns were not well responded to. **We will continue in our endeavour to respond to the very highest standard in all instances of parental concern.**

(11) I receive valuable information from the school about my child's progress

94% of parents felt that they received valuable information on progress as opposed to 90% last year, 3% didn't know & 3% disagreed citing that they would like more regular updates than once per term.

Other

(12) Would you recommend this school to another parent?

As for last year, 94% of parents said that they would recommend, 4 didn't know but no one disagreed. Of the comments that were written, they were extremely complimentary.
